Every day grieving parents tell us how it takes every scrap of courage to ask for help after the devastating loss of their baby or child.

But over the last twelve months we've seen a huge 55% increase in demand for grief support and for the first time in our history, we had to introduce a wait list for grief counselling.

When I wrote to you in May there were 75 heartbroken families waiting to be matched with a counsellor to help guide them through their overwhelming grief.



This month, your amazing generosity has helped fund a brand NEW counsellor position, and we have been able to match all 75 families with a counsellor!

My own Red Nose counsellor was such a vital part of my healing journey when my son Ben died.

I remember how it felt to be understood and supported... to know that I didn't have to walk this endless dark path alone.

Counselling is a vital part of many families' grief journey and thanks to you, none of those 75 families have to wait any longer for a caring hand to guide them out of the darkness.

As both CEO and a bereaved mother, I thank you from the bottom of my heart.

I can never repay the support I was given, but from the bottom of my heart I want you to know that my Red Nose counsellor saved me.

When a baby dies there is often little warning, leaving parents in shock and unable to organise clothing and funeral items – all while trying to say such a heartbreaking and unexpected goodbye.

It is even harder for parents who experience a miscarriage, premature birth or stillbirth where clothing needs to be so much smaller than any store sells, or specially designed for fragile babies.

Because of your generosity, grieving families are gifted special miniature clothing and angel boxes, so they can focus on cherishing the last moments

Having a new baby is a wonderful but often overwhelming time, and SIDS is still every parent's greatest fear.

With new research emerging all the time and a lot of misinformation online, it can be truly hard for a parent to know who to trust when reading information about how to keep their baby safe.

#### Thanks to your support, our Safe Sleep Advice Line is there to help educate and reassure parents on how to best keep their precious new baby safe.

Experienced mum Tea\*, didn't think she'd have concerns about her new baby's sleep, but when her second-born met a new milestone she wasn't sure what to do.

"I called the Safe Sleep Advice Line and they reassured me that tummy sleeping is a risk for very young babies, but because my son was six-months-old and able to roll onto his side and back again, it was OK to let him find his own sleeping position after I'd put him down."

"The Red Nose Nurse also gave me really helpful advice on how to ensure his cot was safe from hazards, so I just made sure the cot was clear and he was wearing a safe sleep suit."

"I still put him to sleep on his back, but I don't panic if he moves himself now."



I'm a second-time-mum, but I still have questions and things I'm unsure about, so for peace of mind I think it's always worth checking, no matter how experienced you are!
