DEFINITIONS

Sudden Unexpected Deaths in Infancy including SIDS. SUDI

All fetal and neonatal deaths of at least 400 grams birthweight or at least 20 weeks gestation. Perinatal Neonatal Deaths within 28 days of birth.

Fetal deaths (if the birthweight is at least 400 grams or the gestational age is 20 weeks or more).
